**RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS**  
**THE REV. DR. MATTHEW CALKINS**

I write on the first day of spring, a beautiful day of sunshine. I am pretty sure there are crocuses waiting to show themselves to the eager air somewhere beneath the still substantial snowpack.

I think I echo the sentiments of everyone in saying, we're ready. Come, spring.

I also echo the old prayer used by St Paul at the end of his first letter to the Corinthians: "Come, Lord" (1 Cor 16:22). The Greek (*maranatha*) reproduces an Aramaic expression (*Marana tha*) used by early Christians. Aramaic is the cousin of Hebrew that was the native language of Jesus. Which means it is likely that Jesus would have said "*Marana tha*" to pray to his Father: Come, Lord, come, Abba (Aramaic for Papa). We know the version he taught the disciples: Our Father (Abba) in heaven, holy is your name; your will be done, your kingdom come to earth as it is in heaven.

The old prayers have a way of sticking around and becoming new again. We have recovered an ancient understanding that the promise of God is not so much that we will die and ascend to heaven, but that heaven, in the end, will descend to earth. John of Patmos describes this in the book of Revelation, chapters 21-22 in the picture of a New Jerusalem descending to earth.

In a certain way, it is already here. Paul also wrote this: "If anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!" (2 Corinthians 5:17; cf Galatians 6). We can participate in new creation even now through participation by faith in Christ. "Now is the acceptable time" (2 Cor. 6:2).

The New Testament scholar and Anglican bishop N.T. Wright has written how this picture, quite different from the cartoon one of souls entering pearly gates on puffy clouds, is the authentically biblical one. Early Christians believed that the resurrection of Jesus had already ushered in the new age, though its full reality was waiting to be revealed. Wright writes this:

The gospel of Jesus Christ announces that what God did for Jesus at Easter he would do not only for those who are "in Christ" but also for the entire cosmos. It will be an act of new creation, parallel to and derived from the act of new creation when God raised Jesus from the dead... God will redeem the whole universe; Jesus' resurrection is the beginning of that new life, the fresh grass growing through the concrete of corruption and decay in the world. That final redemption will be the moment when heaven and earth are joined together at last, in a burst of God's creative energy for which [the resurrection] is the prototype and source. (*Surprised by Hope: Rethinking Heaven, the Resurrection, and the Mission of the Church*; N.T. Wright, 2008; Chapter 8).

Yep, spring is here. And Easter is coming.

## (Re)Connect, (Re)Commit, Renew: Be Confirmed, Received or Renew Your Baptismal Vows

We are all on a spiritual journey, trying to get closer to God. Would you like to deepen your understanding and practice of the Way of Jesus?

Our diocesan bishop, the **Rt. Rev. Andrew Dietsche**, will be making a visit to Grace Church on **June 11<sup>th</sup>**, two days before the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the consecration of the first Grace Church in Hart's Village. So, we will celebrate.

The bishop will also be confirming a cohort of young people who have been taking confirmation class over the last year or two. And you can join them if you like, and be **confirmed**, if you never were (by a bishop in apostolic succession anyway), or **received** into the Episcopal Church (if you were confirmed in another apostolic tradition such as the Roman Catholic church), or **renewed** in your baptismal vows (it may be the right point in your journey).

Fr. Matt will meet with those adults who are interested in this spiritual opportunity on April 2<sup>nd</sup> after the 10 o'clock service (around 11:15) in the Choir Room. We will look at what is involved and each adult will be invited to arrange one to two meetings privately with Fr. Matt to discuss what preparation/instruction is most appropriate for that person.

It's April; as Chaucer knew, this is a great time to make a pilgrimage of trust. Contact Fr. matt for more information.

### March was Kidney Month.

While kidney disease increases as we get older, it can affect anyone at any time. As people of faith we are called to care for our body, mind, and soul.

You can keep your kidneys healthy longer by taking steps to control your diabetes and high blood pressure.

Manage your diabetes and high blood pressure by:

- Eating heart healthy foods: fresh fruits, fresh or frozen vegetables, whole grains, and low-fat dairy foods
- Cutting back on salt
- Limiting your alcohol intake
- Being more physically active
- Losing weight if you are overweight
- Taking your medicines the way your provider tells you to
- Keeping your cholesterol levels in the target range
- Taking steps to quit, if you smoke, and
- Seeing your doctor regularly. \*

- Have your parish nurse (faith community nurse FCN) educate about blood



pressure and hold blood pressure clinics when available. \*\*

- Serve healthy food at potlucks, coffee hours, community meals, etc.
- Provide prayer shawls or blankets to dialysis patients.
- Hold a walking club for members and for the community.
- Contact Kidney Mobile for hosting a screening day for the community. \*\*\*
- Provide gardening space, or bring in produce to share with each other when available.
- Have a recipe contest (even a tasting contest) for healthy, low salt recipes.
- Let EHM know what other ideas or ways you have met this need so we can post them too.

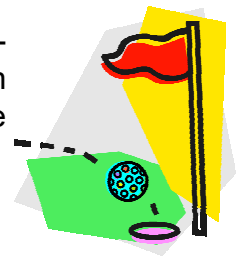

### Immigration:

As you must know by now, it has been a very trying time within the Immigrant Community. GLO is collaborating with many agencies, politicians and public officials to procure the correct information to distribute to the immigrant community. We are working to foster calmness and conquer the extreme fears within our local communities. Rumors and erroneous information is an evil we are dealing with daily. We have sponsored several 'Know Your Rights' Seminars in Millerton and Millbrook, and have circulated correct information. We will be having 'KYR' seminars in Dover and Pawling within the next several months.

We want to provide our local communities precise information in order to accomplish the task of assisting the immigrants within our communities. GLO is composing a list of "How to assist Immigrant Neighbors" for the community at large. Please keep the Immigrant Community in your prayers.

### ESL Classes:

We have resumed the ESL class in Amenia at St. Thomas Church, with our gratitude to Rev Betsy Fisher and the St. Thomas Vestry for their hospitality. Cecilia Acerbo, GLO ESL Coordinator is the instructor. On the first evening of class there were three students.

Fr. Jose Martinez of MESA in Dover, Holy Trinity in Pawling and St. Andrews in Brewster (AKA Harlem Valley Ministry) has requested GLO's assistance to begin an ESL class Brewster. Brewster has a sizable Hispanic/Latino population who will benefit from a beginners ESL class.
