

RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

THE REV. DR. MATTHEW CALKINS

Saying Grace


Wednesday mornings at 9:30 I join the children and teachers of Grace Preschool for a short chapel service. We sit in a circle and begin with a simple grace they've taught me: "Thank you for the world so sweet. Thank you for the food we eat. Thank you for the birds that sing. Thank you, God, for everything. Amen."

It is one of the highlights of my week. I look at their beautiful faces, and feel for that moment that we have come into a sacred clearing, for surely God is here too, sitting quietly in the back. And how wonderful then to go back up the hill to join the faithful few who come to the 10 am Wednesday morning healing and holy communion service. The average age a bit on the older side, you might say. The faces still beautiful, though wrinkled, and still sweet the voices raised in prayer. Grace is a sacred place.

Thank you God for everything.

When we say grace, at home or at church, or wherever we happen to be—what are we doing? Giving thanks, of course ("Thank you God"), and asking for God's con-

tinuing blessing, for us and for those whom we care for. One classic grace asks God to bless this food to our use and us to God's service—and keep us mindful of the needs of others. Grace is a sacred circle of blessing: from God to us, from our hearts to God, to our hands and bodies, from our hands and minds to a world hungry for the bread of life, the word of God, the good news of Jesus, the Spirit of love.

As an ordained clergy person, sort of a professional grace-sayer, I am often asked to say grace before a meal at homes or other occasions. I am happy to do so but given a choice prefer the host family to say grace. Do you have a favorite? What do you say, what do you teach your children? I would love to hear from you. Perhaps we can make a collection of “graces of Grace.”

Perhaps we can learn to practice saying grace in new ways and different places.

What would that look like? Maybe it wouldn't even involve folded hands or memorized words, but a thank you or a recognition or a compliment—like a blessing to the one who didn't know she was doing so well, or an acknowledgment that more than money is exchanged for skilled craft and hard work. We offer a blessing quickly after someone sneezes. It might be nice to offer one on other occasions as well. How quickly can the currency of blessing grow?

As we give so we receive. (Forgiveness works this way too.) Stories of grace flow through our lives—but often they slip by quietly, too shy to make a fuss, and the small ripples in the pond fade from memory. But if we learn to pay attention to how grace is moving through our lives and among people and the world in its beauty (thank you for the birds that sing), and if we ask of ourselves and others: “tell me a story of Grace...” Well, then the stories will ripple back again, and grace abound.

We share “stories of Grace” at the end of our Vestry meetings. Perhaps we

should also share one each Sunday—a short testimonial. Sounds good to me. How about you? Do have such a story? Would you like to say grace?

Lent Madness 2016, Starts February, 11th



Lent Madness 2016 – Pick up your scorecard from the back of the church!

What do you get when you combine a love of sports with Holy Saints? Lent Madness of course. Based loosely on the wildly popular NCAA basketball tournament, Lent Madness pits 32 saints against one another in a single-elimination bracket as they compete for the coveted Golden Halo. But it is more than that: Lent Madness is really an online devotional tool designed to help people learn about saints. Here's how it works: on the weekdays of Lent information is posted about two different saints on www.lentmadness.org and then participants vote to determine who goes on to the next round. Each pairing remains open for a set period of time – usually 24 hours – and people vote for their favorite saint. 16 saints make it to the Round of the Saintly Sixteen; eight advance to the Round of the Elate Eight; four make it to the Faithful Four; two to the Championship; and the winner is awarded the Golden Halo. This year Lent Madness features a slate of saints ancient and modern, Biblical and ecclesiastical as they vie to fill the shoes of 2015 winner Saint Francis. This all kicks off on "Ash Thursday," February, 11 and will continue throughout the 40-day season of Lent. To participate, log onto www.lentmadness.org, where you can also print out a bracket (and sign-up for daily emails for each contest) and fill it out to see how you fare or "compete" against friends and family members. Like that other March tournament, there will be drama and intrigue, upsets and thrashings, last-minute victories and Cinderella's. If you're looking for a Lenten discipline that is fun, educational, occasionally goofy, and always joyful, join the Lent Madness journey. Lent needn't be all doom and gloom. After all, what could be more joyful than a season specifically set aside to grow closer to God?

GRACE CHURCH ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES

JANUARY 24, 2016

Opening Prayer and Welcoming Remarks: Father Matt led us in prayer for the Parish and for the church parish meeting. Father Matt expressed his appreciation for all the hard work that has been done this past year, for the vestry and for attendance at the annual meeting.

Call to order: Father Matt called the meeting to order at 11:33 am.

Recognition of Quorum: The clerk reported that there was a quorum.

Election of New Vestry Members and Warden: Father Matt asked if there were any other nominations for the vestry. Bill Hogan announced the names of the nominees: Evelyn Garzetta, Richard Lucal and Elsbeth Willis as vestry members and Barbara Rudy as Warden. Connie Kinsey moved to accept the nominations. Cathy Shanks seconded. All were in favor. Father Matt asked for a motion to accept the slate. Karen Quinn moved to accept the slate. Dianne McNeil seconded. All approved unanimously.

Recognition of Vestry Members Leaving: Father Matt recognized Paula Wilson, Doug Capers, and Betty Rae Nittiskie for their service on the vestry and Katherine Mustello for her service as a warden. Paula thanked the parish for the opportunity to serve. Katherine also expressed her appreciation. Father Matt noted that the church is blessed with wonderful energy and a strong lay leadership.

Reception of Ministry Reports: Father Matt read the first two paragraphs of his report. He encouraged us to read the report for the details as they relate to the five ships: worship, fellowship, discipleship, partnership and stewardship. There are wonderful things happening in each area. He spoke of our youth programs and thanked John Lacey, Jonathan Shanks and Betty Rae Nittiskie for their work with the children/youth.

He also reported that a new youth initiative called CONNECT has been

formed. Youth from Grace, St Paul's, Pleasant Valley and St Paul's, Poughkeepsie meet once a month getting to know one another and developing ideas for service projects.

Father Matt talked about EPIC and introduced Abby Nathanson, Program Director. Abby introduced two students who came today: Joelle Weir, 14 from Arlington and Cassandra Zeno, 14 from Pine Plains. Both young ladies spoke about the program.

Dianne McNeil spoke about the new Health Care Ministry program. She asked for the parish what is needed from her and if anyone had any program needs to let her know.

Budget Presentation: Cathy Shanks noted that for a little church, we are carrying out God's work in a big way. She referenced the documents in the annual meeting report as she spoke, noting the following: 2015 expense was higher than projected; operating income was higher than budgeted; many good programs. She also thanked the Finance Committee (Barney Calame, Lynn Kasin, Kurt Barnes and Larry Graham) for their work throughout the year and in developing the 2016 budget. Father Matt then summarized the budget documents. As we grow in pledges and increased attendance, we hope to reduce the deficit. He hopes to have a planned giving campaign in the fall. He reviewed the Mission Budget pie chart on page 8. He noted that the fundraising program is strong. He also addressed the success of the pre-school in 2015 increase in attendance and increased days and receipt of a gift from the Moritz Foundation for the playground area. He also spoke about the Strategic Planning Process that began a year ago with the Mutual Ministry Review with Father Masud. We will be meeting in February to work on the development of this plan.

Father Matt asked if there were any questions regarding the budget information. Sharon Schumacher asked for and received clarification on the Dyson

This is religious holiday celebrated in Mexico that marks the end of the Christmas season. In celebration of the 'Candelaria' on February 7th Grace Church will celebrate with a bilingual Service. Trinity Institute Conference

On the weekend of January 21-23, Father Matt along with several members of Grace Church attended this year's Trinity Institute conference, "listen for a Change," on racial justice hosted by our Partner Site, Christ the King in Stone Ridge. Other attendees included Holy Cross Monastery, The Woodstock Jewish Congregation Task Force to End the New Jim Crow, Race Unity Circle in Poughkeepsie and Omega Institute in Clinton Corners.

The conference helped open us up to conversations about race even though they are difficult, uncomfortable, or could risk being perceived as prejudiced. We heard movingly and challengingly from academics, theologians and public figures on the shape of racial injustice in today's world. More importantly, we discussed what, we as individuals, can do about it.

As a follow-up, the group has decided to keep the conversation going by reading presenter Kelly Brown Douglas' latest book, "Stand Your Ground: Black Bodies and the Justice of God," and meet to discuss the book on Saturday, March 12th at 2pm at Christ the King, Storm King. I am planning to go if anyone would like to carpool.

Additionally, Trinity Institute is offering online Lenten classes that continue to explore this theme and the first 2, *Spirituality and Racial Equality with the*
