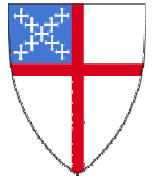

RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

THE REV. DR. MATTHEW CALKINS

All Saints and All Sinners

The House for All Sinners and All Saints (<http://www.houseforall.org>) is a new kind of church out in Denver, Colorado. It is in the Lutheran denomination and pastored by Nadia Weber-Bolz, author of several books, including the recently published *Accidental Saints: Finding God in the Wrong People* and her earlier memoir, *Pastrix: The Cranky, Beautiful Faith of a Sinner & Saint*, both available on Amazon. She is a former stand-up comedian, recovering alcoholic, and has sleeve tattoos. Somewhat out of the standard pastoral model, but funny, brave, faithful and eloquent. I commend her books and the interview she recorded with Terry Gross on *Fresh Air* a few weeks back; find the podcast and take a listen.



I mention Pastor Nadia and HFASS (as they call themselves on their website) because it is an excellent example of a new wave of church "plants" created by and appealing to the "millennial" generation. An example closer to home is St Lydia's (<http://stlydias.org/>) in

Brooklyn, also Lutheran, pastored by Emily Scott—it creates its worship around the preparation and eating of a community supper. During the week, the space is used for “co-working.” Not exactly sure what that is—but I would love to visit and find out (I knew Emily when she attended seminary a few years back).

It is exciting, these new ways of doing church. They are modeling the kind of adaptive change that all life needs to make if it is to thrive in a changing environment.

But roots are as important as wings. Churches, businesses, individuals that change with every season, according to the latest fad or fancy—well, let’s just say that some old pictures look pretty silly, and others downright cringe-worthy, when viewed from the distance of a decade or so.

But style, in the sense of an outward appearance that flows from integrity of character, is enduring as well as fresh with each new morning. The trick (the task of a lifetime) is to develop a self, a sense of purpose and passion, a commitment to the work of one’s life. In the case of a church, the task is to remember the core purposes for which we were planted, as well as to reach out wherever the Holy Spirit is calling us to go. Memory and imagination, prayer and practice, vision and execution. It always works best when these things work together.

Which brings me back to saints and sinners. November 1, All Saints Day, we remember all those who have gone before us—not only those we think of as “saints” in the churchy sense, but those we have known and loved and lost. But it is good to remember also Luther’s observation that we are all simultaneously sinners and saints. We are all saved by the cross, not our own merit. We are all prone to sin and self-absorption. Yet we are all also capable of moments of grace, feeling gratitude, acts of love and kindness.

As we move in the dance of time, in this era of whitewater change, may we remember those who have gone before, encourage those who are coming behind, and walk with integrity and style in the path God has called for us to walk in, the way of Jesus, the way of love and forgiveness and peace.

On Monday, October 5, Charlie suffered a series of seizures that landed him in the hospital. A week later, it has been determined that the cause of the seizures and other serious complications are due to a brain tumor. A course of action is still being determined but it is clear that Charlie and his family have an epic battle ahead of them. Charlie will not be able to work and Heather's income will be seriously diminished as she acts as primary caregiver to Charlie and full-time mom to Caelyn. It's the goal of this fund to provide Heather and Charlie with some small relief--three months wherein they do not have to count household expenses as one of the many stresses they are facing.

Collaboration with Agencies:

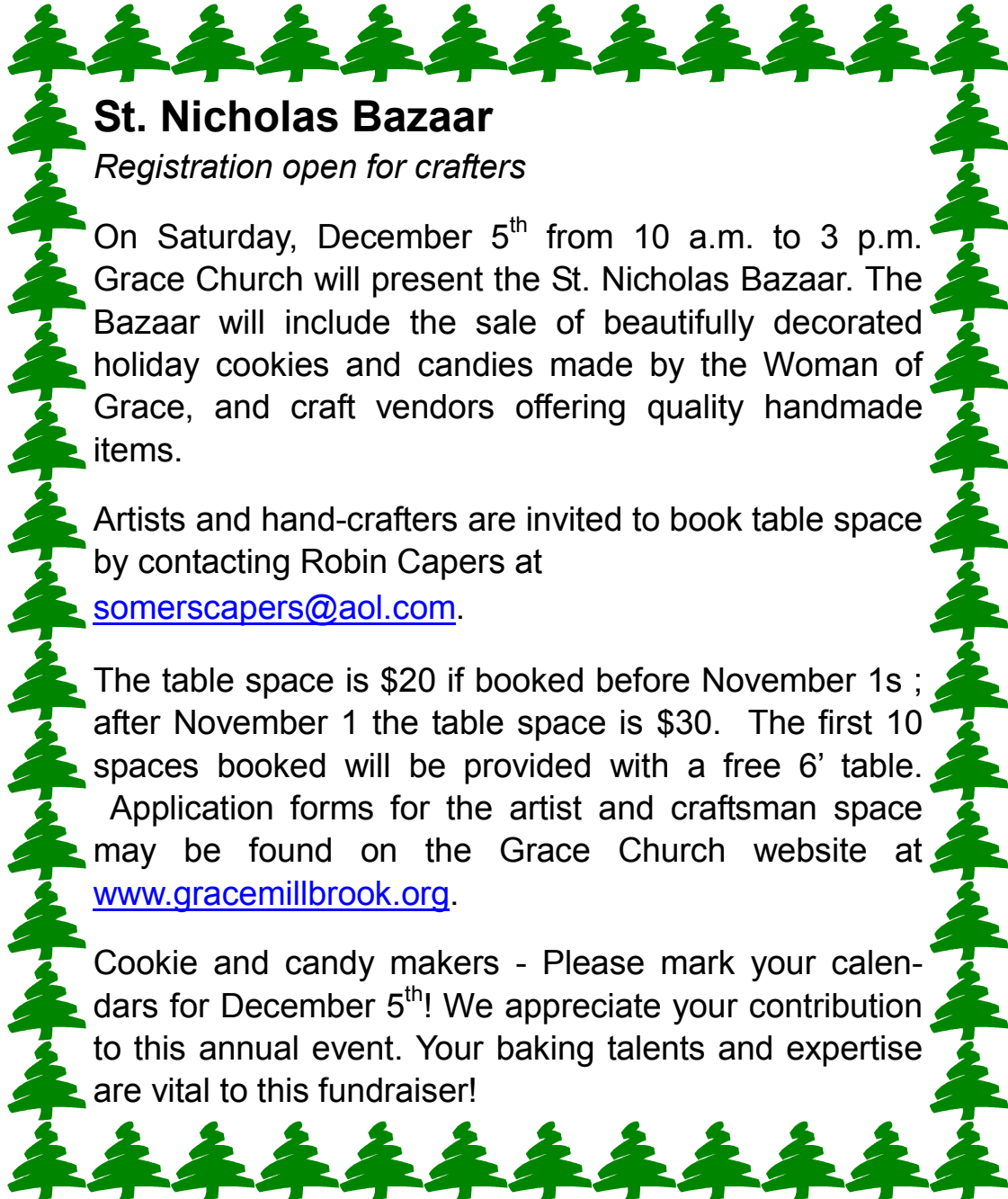

Consecration Sunday Is Coming
Sunday, November 15
One Service at 10:30 a.m.

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

This year we have scheduled the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. *New Consecration Sunday* encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on **Consecration Sunday, November 15, at a 10:30 service** we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary,

benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader, the Rev. Tyler Jones, Rector of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Poughkeepsie, will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and vestry board members. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.

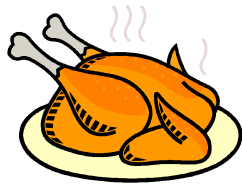
